### MT. ST. HELENS

Visitors from around the world make Kelso their base camp for adventures into the Mt. St. Helens National Volcanic Monument. The Spirit Lake Highway, a few miles north of Kelso, features world-class visitor centers, interpretive displays and awe-inspiring views of America's Volcano. Take the 65-mile drive to Johnston Ridge Observatory for a look inside the crater and experience the raw power of nature in action. The Southern route to the mountain is the gateway for climbers to the Crater's Rim and the awesome geological spectacles of Ape Cave and Lava Canyon.
